For example, lie down (verb + adverb), look up to (verb + adverb + preposition). Most phrasal verbs are formed from a small number of verbs (e.g. take, go, get, set, come, etc.) and a small number of particles (e.g. away, off, up, down, in, etc.). A

The particle in this sense, refers to words that function as prepositions or adverbs in other contexts (e.g., up, on, down, out, around) but do not function as prepositions or adverbs when part of a phrasal verb. 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phrasal verbs do not have a direct object. *An object is a word or part of a sentence that is affected by the action of a verb.
