"The use of solar energy for air conditioning (Duffie & Beckman, [1]) is both technically feasible and profitable for the user, provided the system is designed properly. The main requirements of an air conditioning system that must be satisfied (Althouse et al., [3]) are temperature control, humidity control, air filtering, cleaning and purification and air movement and circulation. The air conditioning system is to be designed for the favourable climate experienced in Darwin. A lithium bromide absorption cooling system will be used for air conditioning, as they require low generator temperatures, are capable of sufficiently low evaporator temperatures, require low pump work and the refrigerant (water) can be used in a direct expansion evaporator system (Chen, [17]). An estimation of the required cooling load for a household of particular size and construction resulted in choosing a refrigerating effect of 8.28 KW. An air cooled absorption system is technically possible (Chen, [17]) and will be used. The condenser and absorber are to be cooled by forced convection, using the same d.c. fan motor employed for the evaporator. Crystallisation is commonly experienced with air cooled absorption cycles (Chen, [17]) and may be avoided by maintaining the condenser, absorber and generator temperatures within acceptable limits using system control devices. System operating characteristics are as follows; generator temperature of 95°C, evaporator temperature of 8°C, absorber and condenser temperatures of 45°C. " -- Abstract/Synopsis.
