This book is about the results of analyzing the Quran with Machine Learning using Natural Language Processing (NLP). This was performed using software developed by Hourglass

Software LLC and leverages Amazon AWS Comprehend service (NLP). Not all Surahs are analyzed, however. Thus, the entire of the Quran is not covered, but we can see the results of analysis of the ones that are. The software performs two primary functions; first, it determines the sentiment of the text (positive sentiment, negative sentiment, or neutral sentiment). Second, it extracts the

top two key phrases of the text (based on Machine Learning confidence score). You will see that each Surah analyzed will show these results. Additionally, there is brief commentary of the top two extracted phrases by providing the context. The analysis is done on the original Arabic text. However, it was also performed on the English translation used. The translations are by Ahmed Ali, Amatul

Rahman Omar, Daryabadi, Faridul Haque, Hamid S. Aziz, Maulana Mohammad Ali, Pickthall, Sarware, Shakir, and Yusuf Ali. The structure of each analysis is first the Surah in Arabic, then the English translation and then details of the analysis. This includes the sentiment, then the top two phrase extraction, and then brief commentary of the extractions. The top extractions

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| <p>are the exact word/s in Arabic, then the English corresponding translation.
